K-Paul's Louisiana Kitchen	0.4 mile 416 Chartres St.	Business Casual No jacket required	A combination of Creole and Cajun cuisine owned by Chef Paul Prudhomme who recently passed away. He is famous for inventing the blackened fish process.
NOLA	0.5 mile 534 St. Louis St.	Business Casual-No jacket required	An Emeril Lagasse restaurant featuring rustic Louisiana and Southern cuisine.
Sac-A-Lait	0.6 mile 1051 Annunciation St.	Business Casual No jacket required	Cody and Samantha Carroll are the stars of the Food Network show Cajun Aces. Their restaurant menu is based on the farming, hunting and fishing influence in our state.

Arnaud's	0.2 mile 813 Bienville	Dinner-Business Attire, Jackets preferred for men  Brunch-Business casual	A legendary restaurant in the French Quarter offering classic Creole cuisine since 1918. This is a fine dining experience and there is a dress code.

Galatoire's	0.1 mile 209 Bourbon St.	Lunch-Business Casual  Dinner-Jackets are required for men	Founded in 1905, they are noted for their fine French cuisine. A legendary restaurant in the French Quarter.
G.W. Fins	0.2 mile 808 Bienville St.	Casual-collared shirts are required for men	One of the newer restaurants in the French Quarter that has already garnered high acclaim. They specialize in seafood from around the globe.
Mr. B's Bistro	201 Royal Street	Upscale Casual No jacket required	A famous French Quarter restaurant well-known for their Creole cuisine. Noted for their BBQ Shrimp. It's not done on a grill. It's sautéed in a Worcestershire-butter sauce.
Muriel's	801 Chartres Street	Smart casual-men should avoid sleeveless shirts and hats	Classic Creole cuisine in a 19 <sup>th</sup> century building. The double cut pork chop is one of their specialties.
Palace Café	0.3 mile 605 Canal Street	Business Casual-No jacket required, jeans discouraged	A very popular spot in the French Quarter. They offer a Contemporary Creole cuisine in a café atmosphere.
Restaurant Revolution	0.2 mile 777 Bienville	Business Casual	A unique combination of Creole and Cajun cuisine. This is quickly becoming a French Quarter favorite.

Drago's	1 mile 2 Poydras Street	Casual	A longtime seafood restaurant famous for their charbroiled oysters. At Drago's they say "Mother nature made the oysters, we just perfected them."

Dickie Brennan's Steakhouse	0.1 mile 716 Iberville Street	Business Casual No jacket required, jeans are discouraged.	Probably the best known steakhouse in New Orleans. Aged beef steaks and huge sides are a staple of this French Quarter restaurant. You can also eat dinner in their bar.
Doris Metropolitan	0.7 mile 620 Chartres St.	Business Casual	A contemporary steakhouse with an authentic mixture of international cuisine.
Galatoire's "33" Bar and Steak	0.1 mile	Business Casual	A traditional steakhouse in the heart of the French Quarter.

Herbsaint	0.8 mile 701 St. Charles Ave.	Business Casual No jacket required	Located on historic St. Charles Ave., it is a mixture of French and Italian dishes with a Southern twist.
Bayona	0.2 mile 430 Dauphine St	Business Casual	A popular restaurant in the French Quarter known for their diverse cuisine. Their slogan is "Our Restaurant Gives You New Orleans. Our Menu Gives You the World."
Domenica	0.2 mile 123 Baronne St	Casual-collared shirts are required for men	Located in the renovated historic Roosevelt Hotel near the French Quarter, they specialize in Italian cuisine.
Luke	0.4 mile 333 St. Charles Ave.	Casual-collared shirts are required for men	A very popular restaurant near the French Quarter, specializing in Franco-German brasseries style food with a New Orleans flair.

Irene's	0.3 mile 529 Bienville St.	Casual	One of the most popular restaurants in the French Quarter specializing in Italian cuisine.
Shaya	3.5 miles 4213 Magazine	Business Casual	One of the most popular restaurants in New Orleans featuring modern Israeli cuisine.

Café Du Monde	0.7 mile 800 Decatur Street	Casual	Established in 1862, this 24-hour coffee shop is known for its coffee and chicory, café au lait (coffee and hot milk) and beignets (a square piece of dough, fried and covered with powdered sugar).
Central Grocery	0.8 mile 923 Decatur Street	Casual	A small Italian grocery store which invented the Muffuletta sandwich. A large sandwich with Italian meats, cheeses and a special olive salad.
